What is **DUAL CREDIT?**

A Dual Credit course is a college class that will count as credit on both your High School transcript, and your College transcript at the same time.

Dual Credit grades affect both your high school and college GPAs.

What is Dual Credit?

Courses are offered through the six South Dakota Board of Regents (SDBOR) institutions and will transfer between each of the six SDBOR institutions, including:

What is Dual Credit?

Courses available through South Dakota Technical Colleges may or may not transfer to other postsecondary institutions in South Dakota. Technical Colleges include:

Lake Area Technical College

Mitchell Technical College

Southeast Technical College

Western Dakota Technical College

How much does Dual Credit cost?

Select dual credit courses are available to high school students in grades 11-12 for **\$75** per credit. Students are responsible for the cost of course credits and any required textbooks or related course materials.

A typical college course is 3 credits.

3 credits X **\$75** = **\$225** + books or related course materials

When you're a freshman at a SDBOR school

3 credits X **\$300*** = **\$900** + fees, books, related course materials

* Approximately, will vary

Who is eligible to take Dual Credit courses?

High school **junior** eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets one of the following requirements:

- a. earn an ACT composite score of 24 reflective of the 70% percentile; or
- b. rank in upper one-third of their graduating class; or
- c. earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.50 on a 4.0 scale.

Who is eligible to take Dual Credit courses?

High school **senior** eligible to enroll in a high school in South Dakota who meets one of the following requirements:

- a. earn an ACT composite score of 21 reflective of the 50% percentile; or
- b. rank in the upper one-half of their graduating class; or
- c. earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 on a 4.0 scale.

Important skills to have for Dual Credit courses:

- **Good time management skills**
- **Self-Motivated**
- **Organized**
- **Focused**
- **Willing to work hard**

What should I know?

- Students are responsible for completing their Dual Credit work even when HHS is not in session.
- Some courses will have prerequisites, ACT admissions requirements, etc.
- The student is responsible for communicating with the professor for any assistance with coursework.
- HHS will accept the dual credit grade as awarded by the college. It will not be weighted.
- The final grade will go onto the student's permanent record and will be factored into their GPA and class rank whether it is a passing or failing grade.
- HHS students receive a ½ credit for any Dual Credit course lasting one semester.

What should I know?

- Dual Credits may affect my eligibility for school activities and NCAA certification
- My eligibility for Financial Aid may be affected by taking Dual Credit classes.
- Dual Credits may not be the best option for all college majors and may affect Technical college tracks.
- If a student fails or withdraws from a Dual Credit course, they are no longer eligible for future Dual Credit.
- Dual credits may not transfer to out-of-state or private colleges.

What should I know?

Colleges and Universities have General Education Requirements

Dual Credit Pathways

Who qualifies for Dual Credit?

Juniors

Must meet graduation or course requirements.
Completion of 10 or 11 credits
Must be in good standing
Must have a 2.5 or higher GPA
Must have a 2.5 or higher GPA

Seniors

Must meet graduation or course requirements.
Completion of 12 or 13 credits
Must be in good standing
Must have a 2.5 or higher GPA
Must have a 2.5 or higher GPA

Considering Dual Credit Math?

Dual Credit math lower than MATH 114 may not count towards Regent's Scholar or the Advanced Endorsement.

New Year-Long College Algebra (MATH 114)

Students must have completed Algebra II and have at least a 3.5 GPA to qualify.

In-Person Dual Credit At HCC

In-person, instructor-lead Dual Credit Courses held at Huron Community Campus.

These courses meet during the school day, in the 7th& 8th periods in your HHS schedule.

Fall 2025 Classes Offered:

PSYCH 101 (General Psychology) will meet from 2-3:15pm Mon/Wed

CMST 101 (Foundations of Communication) will meet from 2-3:15pm Tues/Thurs

HCC Dual Credit Courses are offered at a rate of \$40/Credit X 3 Credits per course= \$120 per class

To register for these courses, you must register online as Dual Credit with the location of Huron AND contact the HHS counseling office so that we can add the class to your HHS class requests.





Common Questions

How do I pay for my Dual Credit Course(s)?

You will receive a bill directly from your University or Tech College, either by mail or electronically in your student account.

How many Dual Credits should I take?

A student is limited to 9 credits per semester, a Dual Credit course is typically 3 credits. If you're new to Dual Credit, starting slow with Dual Credit can help you acclimate to the additional expectations of college courses and professors.

Will my Dual Credits transfer to any other University?

Not necessarily. It is the student's responsibility to check with any institution outside of the BOR and state Technical system about the ability to transfer these courses.

What happens if I want to drop a Dual Credit after the drop deadline?

Students who drop a Dual Credit course may not be eligible to take any future Dual Credits.

Registration for Fall opens tomorrow, April 1st.
Summer Registration is open for current Juniors.

Dual Credit course sections fill up quickly! *Register as soon as possible* to get a spot in the class you want to take.

Dual Credit applications are due by May 16th.
