

Athletic Participation Post High School

Some students desire to compete athletically at the next level. Is that you? If so, there are a couple things you should know.

You can compete at a college/university that is either <u>NCAA</u> (DI, DII, DIII) OR <u>NAIA</u> affiliated. Both have different requirements and guidelines.

- NCAA- you need to create an account with the NCAA Eligibility Center: NCAA.org
 - Before you can be certified to compete at a DI or DII school, NCAA needs to know more about your academic history and sports experiences. To create an "Academic and Amateurism Certification Account"- the most common account for future NCAA student- athletes, it will cost \$100.
 - NCAA Standards
 - NOTE: this is NOT NCSA!! NCSA (Next College Student Athlete) is the largest recruiting network. It is a FOR-PROFIT organization that connects middle and high school student-athletes with college coaches. NCSA Recruiting is a paid-for service. If you are interested in this service visit: www.athleticscholarships.net OR www.NCSAsports.org
 - Coaches count on interested athletes contacting them as early as eighth grade or freshman year of high school. This is ON YOU. Don't wait around for colleges to come knocking!
 - NCAA GUIDE
 - NCAA FAQ's
 - <u>DI and DII Worksheets</u> (for personal tracking of academic eligibility)
- NAIA you need to register with the NAIA Eligibility Center by creating a profile at PlayNAIA.org. NAIA requires student athletes to send specific documentation to be eligible to compete.

SD Farmers Union Foundation Scholarship

Eligibility Criteria:

- Current member of SD Farmers Union

VFW Voice of Democracy Scholarship

Open to ALL students in the 9th-12th grade. Since 1947, the Voice of Democracy has been the Veteran's of Foreign Wars' (VFW's) premier scholarship program. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's these is:

"IS AMERICA TODAY OUR FOREFATHERS' VISION?" What do You Need to Enter?

Record your original 3-5 minute audio essay on a flash drive, or other electronic device. You submit the recording, typed essay and the completed entry form. *Use of ChaptGPT or other AI tools is NOT allowed.

9 Ways to Pay for College Without a Ton of Loans

- Employer Reimbursement
 - Many businesses, in an effort to be competitive and attract top talent, are offering tuition reimbursement/assistance to both full and part-time employees.
- Scholarships
 - Applying for scholarships can be a real hassle, but the upside to that is that many students are discouraged from even trying to get a scholarship. So there is less competition to receive this money. If you have the time and ability to focus and get the process done, scholarships can be a way to help pay for college and they don't have to be paid back!
- Grants
 - As much money gets left on the table with scholarships, even more gets left on the table with grants. And grants also don't have to be paid back! Beyond federal grants, there are also many private grants available to eligible students. Take the time to research and be sure to apply to as many as you can.
- Work Study Programs
 - Do you qualify for your school's work study program? These programs place students in an area related to their chosen field and allows the money they would earn to be used for tuition and other college-related expenses such as books.
- Join the Military
 - Military members can qualify for the GI Bill. Talk to your local recruiter about educational benefits that may be available for enlisting in the US Armed Services.
- **Attend a State School**
 - Moving out of state to attend school, particularly a private school, will cost FAR MORE than attending a school in your own state. Often graduating school without debt means not going with your first choice. A state school will give you a great education and cost a fraction of what a private, out of state school would cost.
- **Take Longer to Graduate**
 - No one says you must graduate college in 4 years. Some students pay as they go, working part-or full-time jobs while in school to pay for each semester as they go. It may take you an extra year or two to graduate, but you won't be carrying around massive amounts of debt when you do!
- Certifications
 - There are many rewarding and high-paying careers that don't necessarily require a 4-year education, and that's where certification comes in. Think of certification as a fast-track to a career you love, that pays well and that can lead to future advancement. When you enroll in a certification program, there is no unnecessary coursework, no undergraduate courses like English and History that are required. You focus your time and effort 100% on the skills you need to enter the workforce and land an excellent job in your chosen field.

What is the FAFSA and why do I care?

- You must submit the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (<u>FAFSA</u>) if you want to apply for federal and state financial aid. Many colleges and universities also require the FAFSA. You must submit it every year that you want aid.
- The form is available online, although PDF and paper versions can be requested. The best option is to complete the <u>web-based version</u>. It includes step-by-step instructions for completing the online version as well as preapplication worksheets.
- You can obtain a FSA ID, which is like your FAFSA login, that will also allow you to <u>electronically sign the form too</u>. If you have technical questions about the Web form, call 1-800-4-FED-AID.
- The FAFSA deadline is the same every year: June 30. However, the federal government and many states award <u>financial aid</u> on a firstcome, first-serve basis, so it's wise to submit the form as soon as it becomes available.
 - Filing your FAFSA online offers several benefits, including:
 - You will get your Student Aid Report (SAR) sooner than with the paper or PDF forms.
 - It will be more accurate, since the online form has built-in edit checks to catch simple errors and you avoid errors introduced by the OCR process.
 - Submitting the form online allows you to list up to ten colleges, while the paper version has space only for four colleges.
