### 5 Ways to Make Your Scholarship Stand Out:

- 1.Be Specific and Make it Personal- Your message has impact! Link content of your essay to your own life.
- 2. Narrate a Story- Your scholarship essay will stand out if you structure it in a way that makes the reader want to know more.
- 3. Blend in the Essay with the Essay Prompt- It is important to paint a picture of what existed before and what is anticipated for the future.
- 4. Understand Your Reader- Familiarize yourself with the scholarship panel who will be awarding the scholarship.
- 5. Follow All Instructions Given- Reading through the scholarship essay prompt several items will help you to pinpoint key areas that you need to pay attention to.

### <u>Tips on How to Write a Scholarship Essay:</u>

- 1. Write a Captivating Introduction grab their attention and compel them to read on.
- 2. Surprise Your Audience- write what everyone else is NOT writing about.
- 3. Refrain from Starting Your Essay or Paragraphs with Distinct Phrases Like: "I am writing this essay to express interest in the University scholarship..."
- 4. Focus On the Essay Topic: Ensure that you have a thesis statement and follow all the instructions given.
- 5. Make Your Essay Personal- Including unique perspectives will make your scholarship essay more memorable.
- 6.Be Clear and Concise-Your choice of words should relate to the topic and try to use the most straightforward language possible.
- 7. Write An Exciting Conclusion The end explains why the topic is crucial and summarizes your work. Avoid "in Summary" or "in conclusion".
- 8. Edit And Proofread Your Essay- Proofreading provides assurance that you have written the best possible way you can.

### **Make It Past The First Round**

### -Do You Qualify?

Sounds simple, but students every year waste time by applying for awards they are not eligible to win. If you don't qualify, don't enter.

-<u>Is Your Application Presented Well?</u>

Type your essay and any other parts of the application if possible.

Writing is messy.

-<u>Did You Include All Required Documents?</u>
Some documents that are frequently required but often left out: transcripts, references, letter of recommendation, resume.

-<u>Did You Answer All Of The Questions:</u>
 Double-check that you haven't forgotten any required information.

### <u>4 Secrets to Winning Scholarships</u>

- Set monthly scholarship application goals.
  - apply for these scholarships LIKE IT'S YOUR JOB!
  - This requires self-motivation, consistency, and discipline.
- Apply for scholarships that require an essay.
  - Many students avoid college scholarship applications that require essays, so you will have less competition.
- Do NOT overlook the \$500 scholarships.
  - Students are drawn to the big scholarships. Meaning fewer students are applying for the \$500 scholarships; your odds of winning these are higher.
- Find scholarships that fit YOUR interests.
  - Scholarship judges notice when an applicant is passionate about a topic/cause.
  - If your interests/goals match the scholarship, your background, experience and passion tend to support the scholarship for which you are applying.

### Filling Out Your FAFSA: Common Errors and How to Avoid them

- Neglecting to complete the FAFSA. Many students assume they won't qualify for aid or feel overwhelmed by the
  process. With the <u>simplified FAFSA form</u> for the 2024-25 school year, the number of questions has been reduced
  from 108 to just 36, making it easier and quicker to complete.
  - The <u>2024-2025 Federal Student Aid Handbook</u> is a great resource
- Submitting inaccurate information on the form. To avoid this mistake, double-check all the date entered, especially details like Social Security Numbers, Dates of birth and contact information. Ensure the income information is accurate and up-to-date. Importing income date from tax records can simplify the process and reduce the chances of errors. The FA-DDX (FUTURE Direct Data Exchange) helps transfer your FTI (Federal Tax Information).
- Planning is crucial when dealing with the FAFSA. Start the application process early and submit the form as soon
  as possible. This way, if any issues arise during the verification process, students will have ample time to resolve
  them without missing the deadline.

## Filling Out Your FAFSA: Frequently Asked Questions

- What tax year does FAFSA use for 2024-25?
  - Applicants should use their income and tax information from the 2022 tax year. This is also known as the "prior-prior" year, meaning it's two years prior to the academic year for which you are applying for aid.
- What are the changes in FAFSA for 2024-25?
  - The 2024-25 FAFSA sees some significant changes aimed at simplifying the application process. The number of questions on the form is reduced from 108 to just 36, making it easier and faster to complete. It will also be easier to import income data from tax records, streamlining the process even more.
- How does the FAFSA Simplification Act affect 2024-25 applicants?
  - The FAFSA Simplification Act implements substantial changes for the 2024-25 Award Year. These changes aim to make it more accessible and simpler for students and families to apply for federal student aid. The lowered number of questions and the improved income data import process are part of these changes. Additionally, individuals without Social Security numbers will also be able to secure an FSA ID for FAFSA.
- Where can I find the FAFSA login for 2024-25?
  - You can access and complete your application by visiting the <u>Federal Student Aid</u> website. Look for the FAFSA login or FAFSA application section on the site to start or resume your application.
