## **Elementary School**

December 4<sup>th</sup> National Dice Day- The ancient Egyptians had games and weighted dice that ensured easy wins. These have also been found in the ruins of Pompeii. Use a large world map and put pictures of your student where their families migrated to America from.

Have families share a favorite cookie recipe, create a Cookie Recipe Book from the family recipes and share between families. It would be fun to include a family photo with the recipe.

Promote family literacy with a Book Study - Choose 2/3 books that students/families would be interested in reading. Take a survey, decide upon a book, and then host weekly virtual book studies with families and students. Encourage families to participate by offering incentives periodically. If you need suggestions on books to read talk to your school librarian.
