Our Exciting New Kitchens at Madison 2-3 Center and Washington 4-5 Center:

We are excited about and were in our two new kitchens today cleaning and preparing for the start of school and are really glad to have our new equipment and wonderfully updated facilities. **THANK YOU!**

Grant Updates:

USDA Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Grant awarded to our three Huron elementary centers for the 2015-2016 school year. The total award amount is \$70, 059.00. In SD there were 74 districts awarded this grant and the grants will serve 128 school sites.

The Arby's School's Out, Foods In Summer Meals Grant was \$3,000.00 in total and was used over the summer months to allow children the opportunity to have transportation to attend our summer nutrition program. We used \$2,500.00 to run a yellow school bus to seven various stops and back each day in Huron from July 6th through August 7th.

For years we have wondered if we were to be able to fund bussing the children from other areas all around Huron if we would serve more lunches and more of our community. Without the funding to try it we have not been able until this year to even guess whether if it would be a successful endeavor or not. We are grateful to have obtained this grant which allowed us the opportunity to finally try bussing in the summer for our program. It was successful in that the children that the small number of children who rode the bus came did come fairly often to lunch, but our total numbers of riders during the 5 weeks was only 44 in total. Clearly not enough to sustain a summer bussing program without benefit of a grant.

Thanks to the ESL Program in June and possibly some students attending by riding our yellow bus we are up only 72 meals; a very slight increase over last year's total numbers of meals. Average meals per day was a respectable 339 over the 44 days of the program.

Staffing:

School nutrition is going into the new school year fully staffed and we have even picked up a couple new food service substitutes.

USDA Regulations:

The Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 is now in its last year. USDA and Congress address will reauthorize funding for our federal child nutrition programs as they do every five years. 2015 is also the year for announcing the newest Dietary Guideline for Americans which encourages eating a healthful diet. We also will elect a new President and congress and both play roles in our program funding and reauthorization...it could be an interesting reauthorization period...stay tuned.

Professional Training for All School Nutrition Program Staff:

The final piece of the Healthy Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010 will ensure school nutrition personnel have the knowledge, training, and tools to plan, prepare, and purchase products to create nutritious, safe, and enjoyable meals.

We are ready to roll out our staff training plan as soon as school begins and have a plan for each of the individual staff members for hours needed to train and what the individual training emphasis for them specifically will be.

Menu Changes:

Our menus are ready and we have made some changes that we hope students will like for example:

Breakfasts were changed up a bit by adding a couple items sampled with students last year and we are adding pancake and sausage on a stick and blueberry muffins to breakfast.

Lunch menus have changed too. We added roast pork loin w/ baby baker potatoes, bringing back Italian dunkers w/pizza sauce, adding macaroni & cheese again w/ hot dogs, bringing back BBQ rib patty sandwich, smiles potatoes, and tri taters.

Manufacturers have done better at lowering calories and sodium which in turn has allowed us room in calories and sodium to add back in more condiments to our menus. Coming back this fall are mustard, pickle slices, sliced fresh onions, and parmesan cheese.

We are slightly expanding the offerings each day on our vegetable bar at MS and HS by adding fresh tomatoes and fresh cucumbers every day.

Week of Menus:

Here is a summary of our school menu planning. I hope this explanation will allow you and parents to understand the planning of school lunches.

I have given you one week's elementary menu (which just happens to be week #2) from our six week cycle menu. The targets we need to hit each week are completely different by age group for elementary, MS, and HS. We figure 27 separate weekly menus including all breakfast and lunch menus district wide.

This "colorful" menu shows what the menu items will be for each day, the portions of each, how many ounces breads/grains are served for the day, how many ounces of meat are served for the day, total servings of fruit and vegetables for each day **and** what color group the vegetables are in for each day. It also shows total calories, total fat, saturated fat, sodium, sugar, fiber, Trans fat, and if the item served is whole grain. The three yellow totals lines at the bottom of each day of the week reflect which type of milk a student may choose.

On the third page please see "weekly targets" these are our targets to hit exactly or be under as an average for the week. Note bread target says 8 to 9 per week and we are at 12 this week. Same with meat it says 8 to 10 per week and we are at 10.5. USDA relaxed these areas and we must provide the minimum amount required but are allowed to over in only these two areas. We have done so to better meet total calories and provide more well rounded nutritious meals.

Calories must be between 550/650 per day as an average at this grade level and are at 639 average if a student chooses chocolate skim milk...we try to get as close to the high calorie limit allowed to offer the most food to students and still be inside our targets.

Total fat and saturated fat are all well below our target. Trans fat must be zero. Sodium is a challenge to stay under and we have done so while hitting all required targets and menu items. Sugar and fiber have no targets *yet*, but we list them anyway on our menus.

Fruit needs to be served in differing total target amounts for each grade level.

Lastly, please note the colors for the vegetables that say dark green, red/orange, Legumes, starchy, and additional vegetable. Each grade level again has differing total target amounts of vegetables that need to be served each week; plus in conjunction we need to serve each of these "colors" and "types" of vegetables in specific target amounts each week also.

This was a summary of how our school menus are planned and how we allow for all the target variables. I hope this again helps explain why our menus are planned as we do and appreciate your time.

My name is Karla Sawvell, MS kitchen team leader, thank you for this time at tonight's meeting.

Your support again this year as we operated the Summer Food Service Program is very much appreciated. The service dates were June 8 through August 7.

Classes for the 15-16 school year are about to begin and we invite our board members, staff, parents and the community to eat lunch with us any time this year.

VETERAN'S PREFERENCE

If at the time a veteran submits an application for employment or employment promotion in the District the veteran possesses the qualifications and business capacity necessary to discharge the duties of the position involved, and is a citizen and resident of the state, the veteran shall receive preference for appointment, employment, and promotion. For the purposes of this policy, the term "veteran" means any person who

- (1) has served on continuous federalized active military duty for a period of at least ninety days for reasons other than training the full obligation for active duty, reserve, or National Guard service in the military, or received an early discharge for a medical condition, hardship, reduction in force, or at the convenience of the military; and
- (2) has been separated or discharged from such service honorably or under honorable conditions.

An applicant wishing to be given veteran's preference must submit written verification from the military that the applicant satisfies the definition of veteran as set forth above.

Age, loss of limb, or other physical impairment which does not in fact incapacitate does not disqualify the veteran. A veteran who has a service-connected disability shall be given a preference over a nondisabled veteran.

If a veteran applies for appointment for employment under this policy, the District shall, before employing anyone to fill the position, investigate the qualifications of the applicant. If the applicant is of good moral character and can perform the duties of the position, the applicant shall be employed in the position.

All applicants for employment, including veterans, are subject to criminal background check requirements as set forth in state law.

Expense Reimbursement (Lodging, Mileage, and Meals)

The following guidelines will apply to out-of-district travel.

Within state:

- Lodging must be receipted.
- When a school fleet vehicle suitable for the travel purpose is not available, mileage by auto will be paid on the basis of the current state approved rate per mile traveled (distances to main cities visited are established and on file in the business office).
- When a personal vehicle is taken in lieu of an available school fleet vehicle, mileage will be paid at the rate of .18 per mile traveled (distances to main cities visited are established and on file in the business office).
- 4) Air travel must be approved by the superintendent or his/her designee.
- 5) Meal allowance will be paid based on the current state approved rate.
- 6) Whenever students are provided meals and lodging at district expense, coaches and other school officials will be afforded the same meals and accommodations.

Outside state:

Expenses for travel <u>outside of South Dakota</u> will be paid according to current state approved rate.

Whenever students are provided meals and lodging at district expense, coaches and other school officials will be afforded the same meals and accommodations.

In-District

The following guidelines will apply to in-district travel.

Staff members who perform assigned duties in more than one school will be paid mileage at the current state approved rate. Mileage will be paid on the distance between the schools they are assigned to on a given day.

The staff member who has been authorized mileage will submit a completed voucher to the business office for payment.

In most situations, there is no meal expense allowed for in-district travel. There are occasions when the District will offer to provide a meal; i.e., "State of the Schools," "Board –Administrator work-sessions," etc. These will not be vouchered but will be directly billed and paid by the District. When the District hosts an event that requires attendance through the meal time; i.e., ESD Principals, Activities Directors, etc. .. and the meal would have been allowed had the event been in another community, the direct bill for a work session meal may be requested for approval from the superintendent in advance of the event. This must be specifically approved on a travel request, stating cause, and dictating maximum allowable dollar amount. Note: Attending regularly scheduled luncheons; i.e., regular Chamber meeting, Community Counseling meeting, etc., do not qualify for this exception.





HURON MIDDLE SCHOOL GUIDELINES FOR IPAD USE

Huron School District is proud to offer our 8th Grade Huron Middle School students Apple iPads devices for use at school. The 1:1 iPad Program, which provides mobile computing and wireless technology to all 8th Grade Middle School students, has been designed to enhance the delivery and individualization of instruction. The focus of the iPad program at Huron Middle School is to provide tools and resources to the 21st Century Learner.

The guidelines, procedures, and information in this document are in addition to the Huron Middle Schools Responsible Usage Policy and Internet Usage Policy. Teachers may set additional requirements for iPad use in their classroom.

A. General Precautions and Rules for iPad Use

- 1. The iPad is school property that you are being allowed to use.
- 2. Students are responsible for keeping their iPad in good working order.
- 3. Any damage to the iPad should be reported by contacting the school Principal.
- 4. Use only a soft cloth to clean the screen, no cleaners of any kind.
- 5. No writing or stickers should be applied by the student.
- 6. Sound must be muted at all times unless permission has been given by a teacher. Earbuds may be used only when permission has been given by a teacher.
- 7. Music should only be accessed only if permission is given by a teacher.
- 8. Gaming is not allowed on the iPad unless directed by a teacher.
- 9. Students are not to take photos or video unless it is being used in a project.
- 10. Students are not to use any social media sites during school
- 11. No iPads in the restrooms, locker rooms, or at lunch.
- 12. Only school appropriate backgrounds and screen savers may be used on the iPads. Examples of inappropriate backgrounds include the presence of weapons-related materials, pornographic materials, inappropriate language, alcohol, drug, gang-related symbols, etc... These types of pictures on the iPad or within its files will result in disciplinary action and where appropriate, referral to law enforcement.
- 13. Passwords on lock screen are not to be used. The iPad is the property of the school district. Therefore, school staff members have the right to check any material stored on a student's iPad at any time.
- 14. No Printing is allowed on school issued iPads.
- 15. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that work is not lost due to technical failure or accidental deletion. iPads malfunctions are not an acceptable excuse for not submitting work. All important files and projects should be backed up on eBackpack.
- 16. The apps originally installed must remain on the iPad in usable condition and be easily accessible at all times.
- 17. Student iPads will be filtered through the districts Internet content filter. (iPads are monitored remotely at all times.)
- 18. Lockers are to be locked when storing your iPad. (Must be stored in your locker at lunch.)
- 19. Unsupervised iPads will be confiscated by staff and taken to the middle school office. Each student is responsible for his or her iPad once it has been issued.
- 20. All iPads are to be left in 1st CORE Class at the end of the day and must be plugged in. It is the student's responsibility to make sure they are charged and ready for the next day. Students will pick up their device each morning from their 1st CORE Class.

Key Commitments:

- I will not access or display materials on the iPad websites, apps, games, videos, images, music, etc. while on school grounds that are inappropriate for the school environment or my age group. (ex. Profanity, weapons/violence/blood, sexual content, alcohol/drug use, etc.)
- O I will not acquire and/or share images, audio, or video of others without their express permission.
- O I will not use my iPad outside during lunch or other non-class times unless under the direct permission and supervision of a teacher.
- O I will not play games on the iPad during the school day unless I have specific permission from my teacher or administrator.
- O I will not access, upload, download, share, or distribute offensive, profane, threatening, pornographic, obscene, or sexually explicit materials for any reason.
- o I will not share my Apple ID or any other account information with others, nor use my Apple ID or other account information on someone else's device.
- My sound will be muted at all times unless my teacher gives me permission to use the sound or headphones.
- o I will not touch or use other people's devices (including hardware, apps, media, etc.) without their express permission.
- I will not access (or attempt to access) the accounts, files, data, apps, media, etc. of any students or teachers.

Appropriate Classroom Use

- 1) Each class will begin with iPads put face down on the desk, or below the desk depending on the classroom.
- 2) Teachers who begin the day with an iPad activity will give specific instructions for this activity.
- 3) Students will not use any gaming or social media applications during school.
- 4) Students must have volume on mute or use Earbuds for instructional purposes with teacher permission.
- 5) Student's iPad screens are to be visible to the teacher at all times.
- 6) NO iPads in the Restrooms, at Lunch or in the Locker Rooms.

Consequences for iPad use Infraction:

Actions that violate any of the items in the Respectable Use Policy, Internet Usage Policy, iPad Guidelines or individual classroom teacher iPad policies will result in:

- 1. 1st Offense iPad Confiscated principal referral verbal warning.
- 2. 2nd Offense iPad Confiscated principal referral 30 minute detention.
- 3. 3rd Offense & Beyond iPad Confiscated principal referral 1 hour detention. iPad will be removed for one full day. Student is responsible for the same work through another mode. Parent/student conference.

Since the iPads are the property of Huron Middle School, officials of the school have the right to review all material stored on or accessed by any iPad. School officials may revoke a student's iPad use privileges for misuse or violation of policies.

Repairing or Replacing your iPad

Students will be responsible for damages to their iPads including, but not limited to, broken screens, cracked plastic pieces, inoperability, etc. Depending on the damage and whether or not the damage was accidental or due to a malfunction of maintenance issue, the Huron Middle School District Protection Plan would be used to determine the cost of the repairs. In the case of intentional damage and/or neglect, the student will pay the full repair or replacement cost of the device.

Insurance is available through Huron Middle School. The cost of the insurance protection is \$30 annually per student. Students with an accepted Free/Reduced Lunch application on file with the school nutrition office will pay \$15 annually per student. Checks must be made payable to Huron Middle School. The insurance policy covers one iPad per student per school year for any costs outside the manufacturer's warranty.

All protection plan claims for accidental damage or maintenance must be reported and filed with the Help Desk. In cases of theft or loss, students or parents must file a police report (School Resource Officer must be notified) and bring a copy of the report to the office before an iPad can be replaced with the Huron School District Protection Plan.
